

Rules and General Information

- Entrants under 19 years of age need to have a parent's or legal guardian's signature on their entry form.
- Riders need HCBC membership to bring horses to Cedar Vista Stables
- Entries close 1 week prior to the horse show. Post entries will only be accepted if scheduling permits.
- All riders need to be accompanied by a trainer or person responsible.
- Each horse/rider combination need to have their own entry # in order to compete in a class
- Equine Canada rules are to be followed as a guideline, and Equine Canada Drug rules apply.
- Non-competitor rounds are allowed once that horse and rider are finished competing for the day.
- Horses may enter a class more than once with a different rider.
- Horse/Rider combinations may only move up or down one level at the same show and may choose different levels at other shows.
- Grass reins are permitted in the trot pole class.
- NO cost for lead line class.
- Limited warm up time is available before each division. Please contact show organizers for warm up days available **prior** to the show if needed.
- DRESS: should be neat with fitted clothing (not loose) or a riding jacket. Proper riding boots with a heel or paddock boots and half chaps in good repair.
- All riders **MUST** wear ASTM approved helmets while mounted
- **PRIZES:** Each show will have Championship and Reserve Championship for all divisions. Prizes will be given for first place.
- **POINTS** will be accumulated at each show and follow "the rider" not horse /rider combos.
 - 1st 9 points
 - 2nd 7 points
 - 3rd 5 points
 - 4th 3 points
 - 5th 2 points
 - 6th 1 point

It is the responsibility of the show/event committee, or organizers and the facility owners and managers to ensure that all BC Health Authority and Work Safe BC directives are followed and enforced. Horse Council is not a regulatory body and it is understood and agreed that sanctioning and approval of either a HCBC Provincial circuit event or Equestrian Canada Bronze or Silver competition relates to the use of the rule book and approved officials only".

This Competition is a Horse Council BC provincially sanctioned Competition and will be governed in accordance with the Horse Council BC Rule Book. Knowledge of the Rules is the responsibility of the Competitor.

No Time Allowed (TA) in Equitation Class

*****Fault and Out Class** = Each jump is progressive in points and riders will accumulate points for each jump they successfully complete. Riders will have 45 seconds to jump as many jumps as they can. Prizes to 6th. Each jump cleared is 2 points, a rail is 1 point....winner is the fastest time with the most points.
